SECTION 4: First aid measures

4.1 Description of first aid measures

General information:

8.2 Exposure controls

Individual protection measures, such as personal protective equipment General protective and hygienic measures:

Avoid unnecessary contact with the product. Do not eat, drink or smoke at workplace and keep it tidy. Remove contaminated clothing and wash carefully before reuse.

Hand protection

Material of gloves

Selection of the glove material on consideration of the penetration times, rates of diffusion and the degradation. As the product is a preparation of several substances, the resistance of the glove material cannot be calculated in advance and has therefore to be checked prior to the application.
